History of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated

Twenty-two African American undergraduate women founded Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. on January 13, 1913 at Howard University in Washington, D.C. These visionary young women used their collective strength to promote academic excellence and to provide support to persons in need.

Today, the organization is a sisterhood of predominantly Black, college educated women with over 1,000 collegiate and alumnae chapters located in the United States, England, Japan, Germany, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, the Bahamas, Jamaica and the Republic of Korea.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated is a private, not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to provide leadership and support through established programs in local communities.

Mission

The Mission of the San Francisco Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated is to organize and implement a full program of public service initiatives in the local communities of San Francisco and Marin counties. Scholarship Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- Be a high school senior residing and attending school in San Francisco or Marin county
- Have a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 GPA scale
- Be accepted at a two- or four-year degree-granting college or university
- Demonstrate volunteer experience by participating in community and/or school activities
- If applying for a Memorial Scholarship you must be a relative of a member of San Francisco Alumnae Chapter. Relative is defined as a family member, including legally adopted child or person for which you serve as legal guardian, including foster children, step children, brothers, sisters, daughters, sons, nieces, nephews, grandchildren. You must also meet all requirements which is listed herein this document

Application Contents

To be considered for a scholarship, applicants must submit the following documents:

A **COMPLETED** Scholarship Application Form. Please type or print your responses, including “N/A” for items that are not applicable to you. The application must be completed in its entirety and submitted with **ALL** the items listed below:

- Three (3) separate letters of recommendation from someone who knows you very well (e.g. from a school counselor, school principal, a teacher, pastor or a community agency supervisor for which you volunteered
- Copy of the letter(s) of acceptance from the colleges or universities to which you have applied
- Your most recent OFFICIAL academic transcript, usually the one indicating the grades of the fall semester of the current academic year. You must request your registrar send this directly to you. We will not accept student copies, computer downloads or other unofficial copies. Most schools assess a nominal service fee to send official transcripts.
- A photo, which will not be returned. Photo may be sent electronically.
